I. GUIDELINE:

Care may be initiated for any patient < 28 days of age presenting to the ED with a fever \geq 38 degrees Celsius or 100.4 Fahrenheit rectal. The "Emergency Care Medical Record" is used with these guidelines/protocols for the purpose of documenting the supporting physician's order. **Protocols will not be initiated if there is parental concern or objection or if the physician is readily available**.

Triage acuity should be assigned as "red"

II. PROCEDURE:

- A. The criteria for initiating this protocol includes:
 - 1. Age less than 28 days.
 - 2. Fever 38 degrees Celsius or 100.4 Fahrenheit or higher taken rectally.
 - 3. History of fever (as above) at home with or without antipyretics.
 - 4. Stable vital signs.
 - 5. No respiratory distress.
- B. Obtain a full set of vital signs including blood pressure.
- C. Place patient on a cardiac monitor.
- D. Perform urinary catherization and obtain specimen for urinalysis and culture. Send urinalysis and Urine Culture specimen to lab.
- E. Draw and send to lab the following:
 Complete blood count with differential Blood Cultures
 ** Draw and hold red and green top tube.
- F. Insert peripheral intravenous catheter if this can be done without difficulty while obtaining blood for labs.
- G. Set up for Lumbar Puncture after checking with the physician.
- H. Notify MD when patient is ready for examination.
- I. Caregiver will document in the Electronic Medical Record that protocols were initiated.
- J. Physician will sign all orders prior to discharge from the ED.
